Your Care Manager can review your health insurance coverage and answer any questions you may have about your insurance benefits for Gamifant.

### To help you make informed decisions regarding treatment, your Care Manager can:

- Research your health insurance benefits to help you understand your current coverage for Gamifant
- Work with your healthcare providers to assist with any prior authorizations that may be needed
- Support you and your healthcare providers in the event of a denied insurance claim
- Determine your eligibility for financial assistance programs, including our Commercial Co-Pay Program and our Patient Assistance Program for uninsured patients\*

## Financial Assistance

Gamifant Patient Services provides financial assistance options to eligible individuals. Your Care Manager can work with you to determine eligibility.\*

- **If you have commercial insurance:**
  - You may be eligible for our Commercial Co-Pay Program
- **If you are uninsured or do not have coverage for Gamifant:**
  - For eligible patients, our Patient Assistance Program may be able to temporarily provide you with Gamifant

\*Individuals must meet specified eligibility criteria to qualify for assistance. Sobi reserves the right to make eligibility determinations and to modify or discontinue the program at any time. Patients with Medicare, Medicaid, or other government-sponsored insurance are not eligible for Sobi's Commercial Copay Program or Patient Assistance Program.

## IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

### **GAMIFANT can cause serious side effects including:**

- Infections. GAMIFANT is a medicine that affects your immune system and may lower the ability of your immune system to fight infections. GAMIFANT may increase your risk of serious infections that can lead to death. These infections include tuberculosis (TB), histoplasmosis, Herpes zoster infection (shingles) and other infections caused by viruses, fungi or bacteria that can spread throughout the body. Your healthcare provider will:
  - test you for TB before you start treatment with GAMIFANT.
  - treat you with a medicine for TB if you at risk for TB or if you have a known positive TB test. Infections are common in people treated with GAMIFANT.
- Before starting GAMIFANT, tell your healthcare provider all of your medical conditions and if you:
  - had TB in the past, or if you or a member of your family have been in recent close contact with someone with TB.
  - have ever had a positive TB skin test (PPD).
  - currently have or have had history of infections, including histoplasmosis or Herpes zoster (shingles).
  - are being treated for an active infection.
  - have symptoms of an infection, such as fever, sweat and chills, cough, breathing problems, blood in mucus (phlegm), warm, red, or painful skin or sores on your body.
  - are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if GAMIFANT can harm your unborn baby.
  - are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if GAMIFANT passes into your breast milk. Talk to your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby during treatment with GAMIFANT.
  - Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.
- Your healthcare provider will give you medicine to help prevent certain infections before you receive GAMIFANT.
- After starting GAMIFANT, tell your healthcare provider if:
  - new symptoms of an infection appear.
  - symptoms of an infection that you already had when starting GAMIFANT worsen. Your healthcare provider will monitor you closely for signs and symptoms of infections during treatment with GAMIFANT.

### **GAMIFANT can cause serious infusion reactions, including:**

- Infusion reactions. Infusion reactions are common with GAMIFANT, and can also be severe. Infusion reactions can happen during or shortly after treatment with GAMIFANT. Your healthcare provider may temporarily stop your infusion and treat your symptoms before continuing your infusion if you have severe infusion reactions. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get any of the following symptoms:
  - skin redness
  - itching
  - fever
  - rash
  - excessive sweating
  - chills
  - chest pain or shortness of breath
  - nausea or vomiting
  - lightheadedness or dizziness

### **The most common side effects of GAMIFANT include:**

- high blood pressure (hypertension) and fever. These are not all of the possible side effects of GAMIFANT.
